Synopsis

Background: Husband filed a complaint for divorce and cited wife's habitual and excessive use of drugs as grounds for divorce. Wife filed a counterclaim for a divorce on the ground of habitual cruel and inhuman treatment. The Chancery Court, Covington County, [William R. Barnett, J.](#), dismissed husband's complaint for divorce, and then wife voluntarily dismissed her counterclaim. Husband appealed.

[\[Holding:\]](#) The Court of Appeals, [Griffis](#), Presiding Justice, held that husband did not prove that wife's use of prescription medication was excessive, as was required to obtain divorce on the ground of habitual and excessive drug use.

Affirmed.
